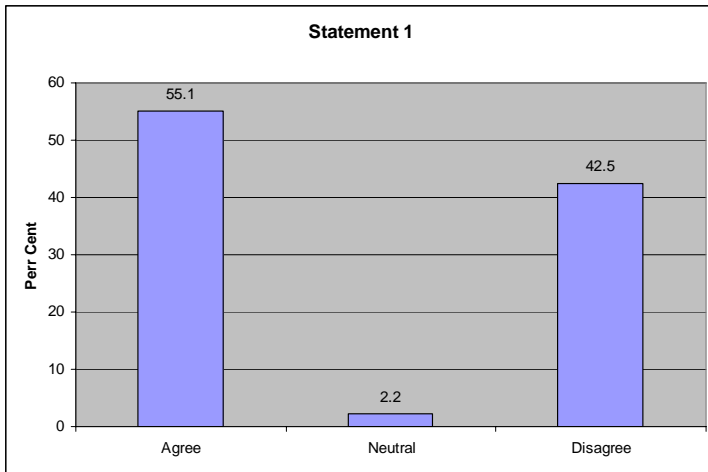
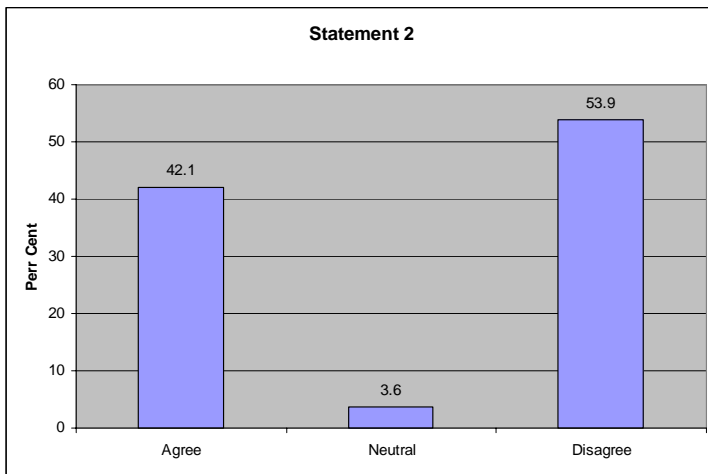

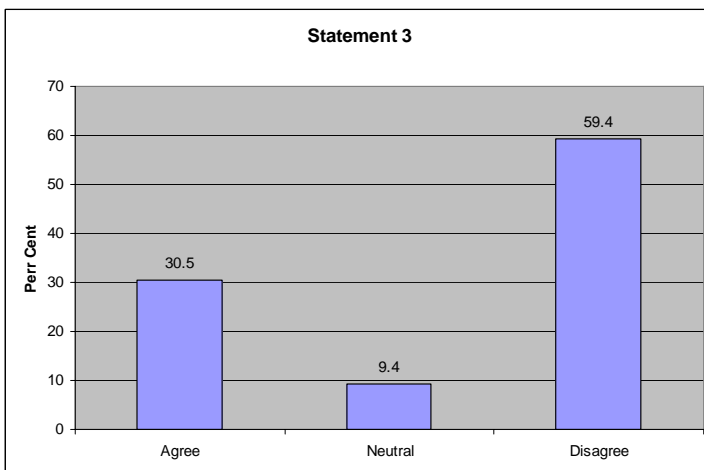
Statement 1

In a residential area, there should be no restrictions on where an RV is parked as long as it is parked on the owner's property.



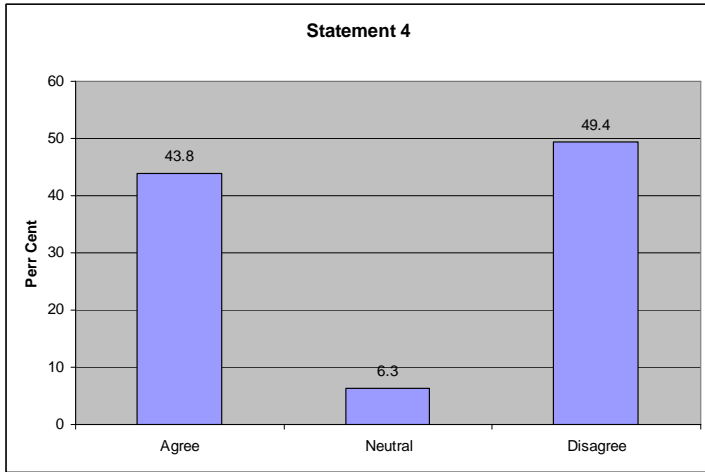
Statement 2

RVs should not be allowed in the front yard of a residential property.



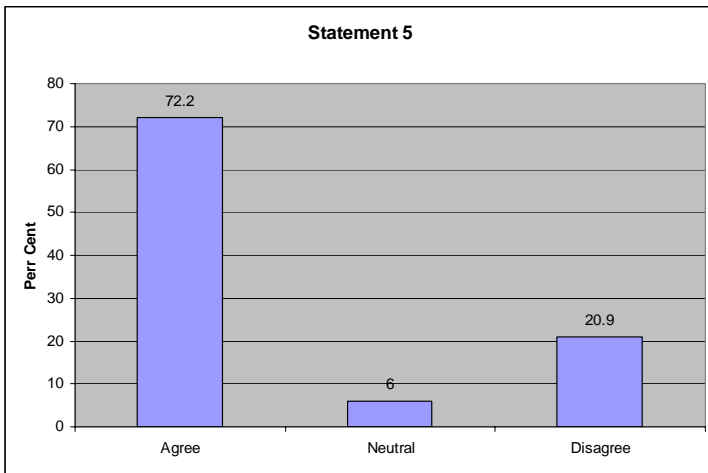
Statement 3

RV parking on private property in a residential area is a safety issue.



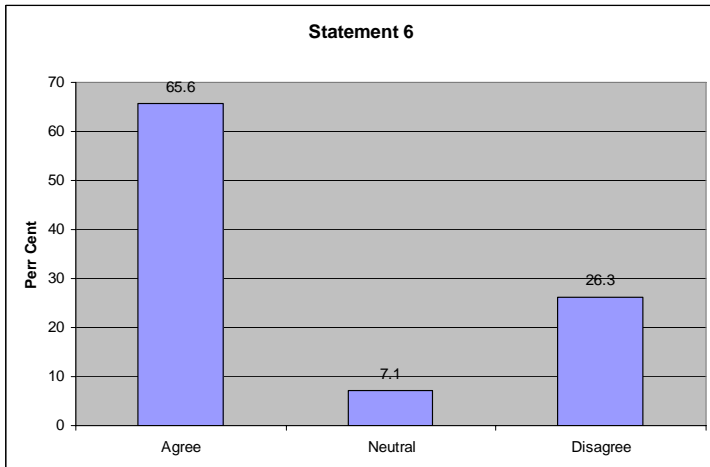
Statement 4

RV parking in a residential area detracts from the appearance of the area.



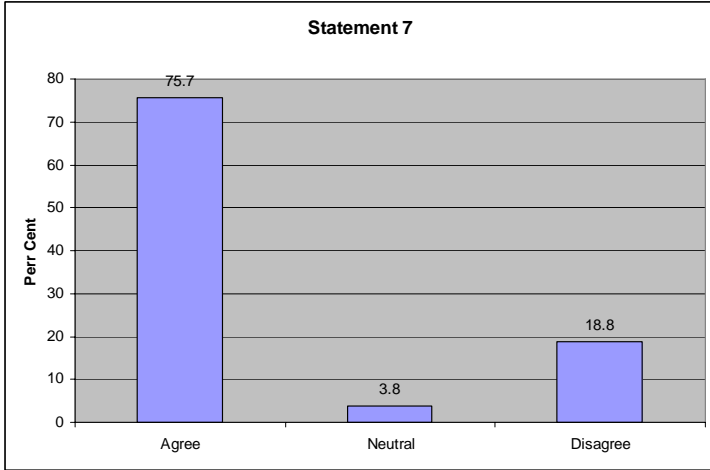
Statement 5

There should be a limit on the total number of RVs parked on private property in a residential area.



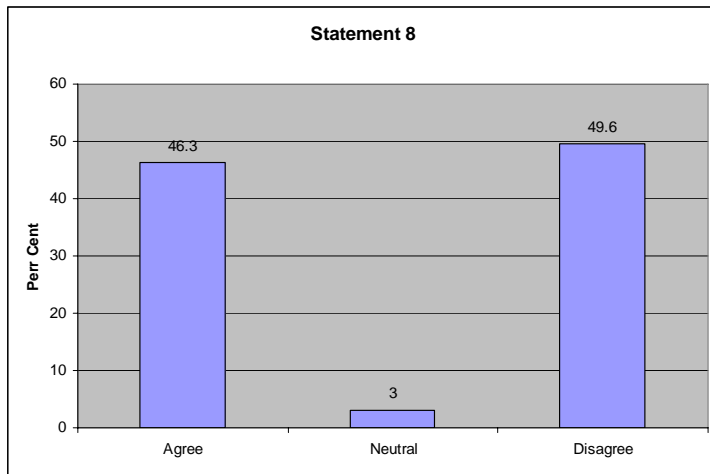
Statement 6

There should be some limit on the number of RVs parked in a side yard or a rear yard of a residential area.



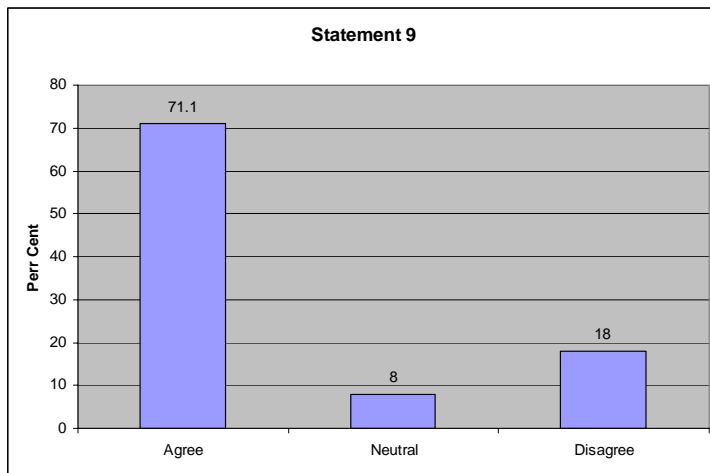
Statement 7

There should be some limit to the number of RVs that are parked in a front yard.



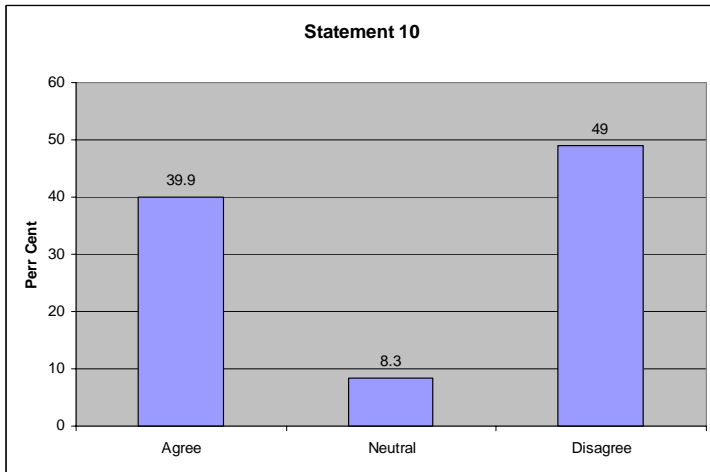
Statement 8

No RVs should be located in a front yard in a residential area for longer than 48 hours (or as necessary to load or unload).



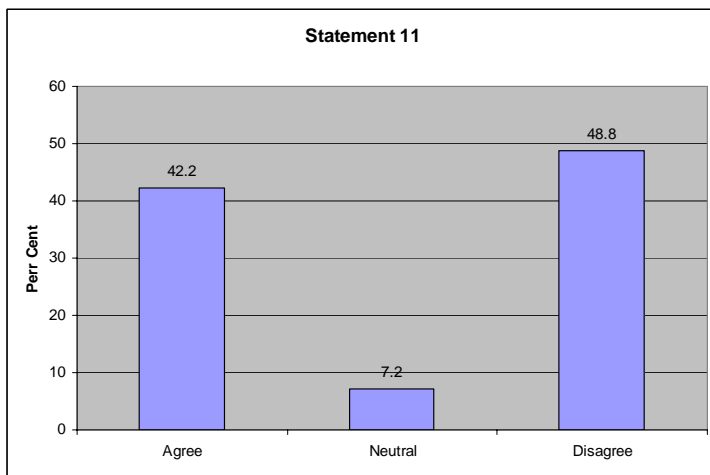
Statement 9
